



PATCHWORK CHRISTMAS STOCKING

Celebrate the season with a handmade touch by creating a quilted Christmas stocking! Designed in CREATIVATE™ Quilting Software and precisely cut using SINGER® MOMENTO™ Craft Cutting Machine. Whether you use the included design or create your own, the software makes it easy to plan, personalize, and stitch a stocking that's uniquely yours.

Finished size: approximately 14" × 20" (35 cm × 50 cm).

- Backing Fabric 2/3yd (60 cm)
- Lining Fabric 2/3yd (60 cm)
- Fusible Batting
- Thread

MACHINE:

- Sewing machine
- SINGER® MOMENTO™ (optional)



Design the Quilt Fabric

Step 1: Open CREATIVATE™ Quilting Software.

Open the associated QPF file to make this design. If you want to design your own quilt, load a preset quilt layout.

Select the 4x6 blocks.

Change the Block Size to 4" (100 mm).

Cut the Pieces

Step 2: Click on the output tab and select the seam allowance you prefer, then go to "Make The Quilt".

If you have a MOMENTO Craft cutting machine, click "Send to Crafting".

Untick the box for Border as we don't want a border for this project.

If you are cutting manually, refer to the layouts in the Yardage Tab.

Note: For this project you will need to make two quilt tops, one for each side of the stocking.

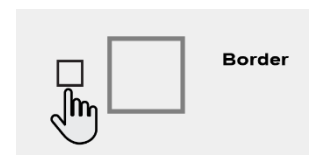
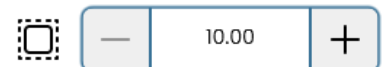


Block Size (mm)

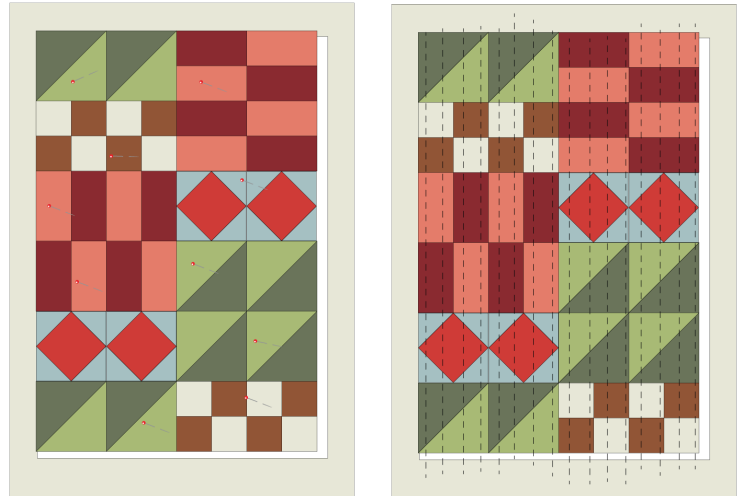
Sewing the Quilted Stocking

Step 3: Follow the Instructions in the Quilting Software to join the pieces together to make the quilt top. Make two quilt tops measuring 16" x 20" (40 cm x 60 cm). Press the seam allowances flat.

Quilt the Layers Together

Step 4: Cut the batting to the same size as the quilt top and fuse it to the wrong side of the quilt, following the manufacturer's instructions. Cut the backing fabric slightly larger and layer it underneath. Pin all the layers together and quilt as desired.

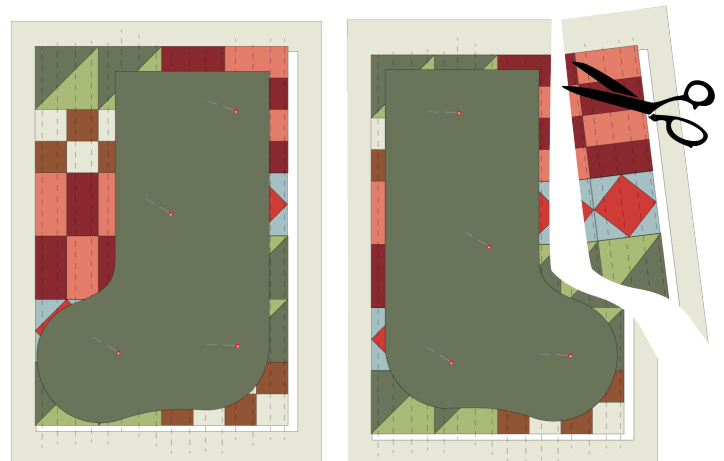
Note: If your machine has an IDT™ (Integrated Dual Feed) system, engage it for smooth, even feeding. If not, use a walking foot. Attach your edge or quilting guide to help maintain perfectly parallel stitching lines.



Cut the Lining

Step 5: Use the cut file or the PDF pattern to cut the stocking shape from lining fabric. Place the lining on top of your quilted fabric and use it as the template to cut the stocking from the quilted fabric. Be sure to cut one left-facing and one right-facing piece.

Note: A 3/8" (1 cm) seam allowance is included in both the cut file and the PDF pattern.

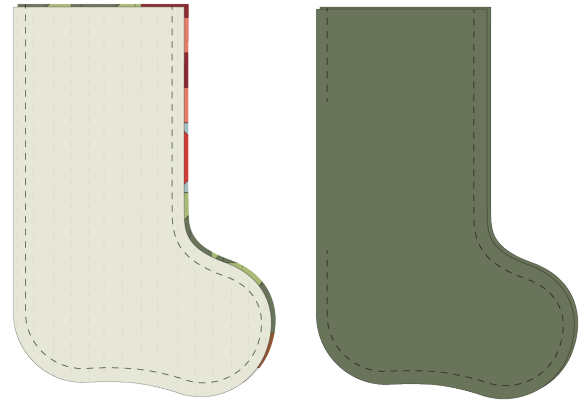




Sew the Stocking

Step 6: Place the quilted pieces right sides together. Clip or pin to secure, then sew around the stocking, leaving the top edge open. Clip the seam allowance along the curves to help the fabric lay smoothly when turned.

Step 7: Place the lining fabric right sides together. Clip or pin and sew around the stocking, leaving the top open. Also leave a 4" (10 cm) opening along a straight seam for turning later.



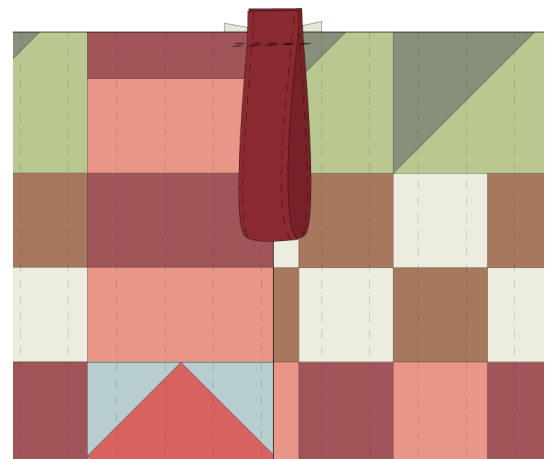
Prepare the Hanging Loop

Step 8: Cut a strip of fabric 3" x 8" (8 cm x 20 cm). Fold it in half lengthwise and press. Fold the raw edges in towards the center fold and press again. Topstitch along both long edges.



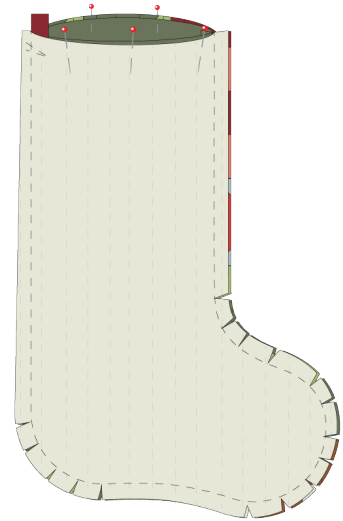
Assembling the Stocking

Step 9: Fold the strap for the hanging loop in half. Pin it to the right side of the stocking, at the center back seam, aligning raw edges. Stitch in place secure.





Step 10: With the lining right side out and the main stocking wrong side out, insert the lining into the stocking so that right sides are facing and seams are aligned. Stitch along the top of the stocking.



Step 11: Turn the right side out through the opening in the lining. Sew the opening closed, then tuck the lining neatly inside the stocking and press. Topstitch around the top edge for a clean finish.

Step 12: Hang your stocking and wait for Santa!
