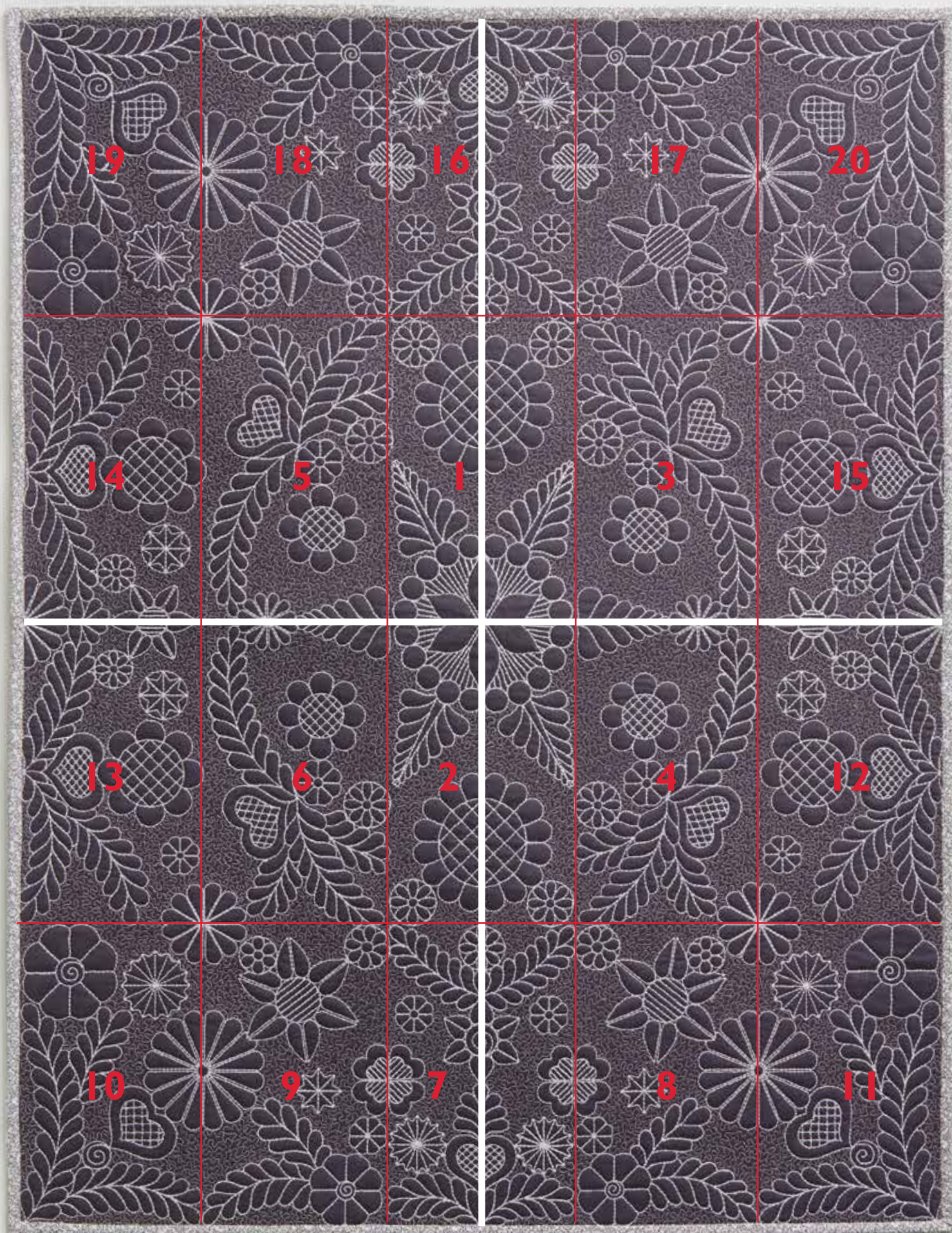
- Grey Fabric 105x85cm (41 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") x2
- Iron-on Batting 105x85cm (41 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ ")
- Fabric for binding 320x5cm (126" x 2")
- Assorted Embroidery Thread
- HUSQVARNA VIKING® Large Metal Hoop 240x150mm (920438096)
- HUSQVARNA VIKING® Interchangeable Dual Feed (920219096)
- HUSQVARNA VIKING® Changeable $\frac{1}{4}$ " Guide Foot (413238345)

1. Press the two grey pieces of fabric wrong sides together with the iron-on batting between.
2. Mark the middle of the fabric.
3. Start embroidering design #1 (see instruction image).
4. Continue embroidering design #2-20, following the same order as shown in instruction image. The design starts with corner position stitches for easy matching. We recommend using the Large Metal Hoop for easy matching and best result.

Important! The design needs to be stretched into correct size before continuing embroidering the next design.

TIP! To achieve a straight line along the side of the embroidery, use a ruler.

5. Stitch a seam around the finished motif and cut $\frac{1}{4}$ " outside the seam.
6. Press the binding in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Pin the binding to the front edge of the quilt with the raw edges aligning with the raw edges of the quilt. Use the Interchangeable Dual Feed with the Changeable $\frac{1}{4}$ " Guide Foot.
7. Fold the binding to the back, press and pin.
8. Stitch from the front with the Changeable Decorative Foot in the ditch with a straight stitch or a decorative stitch.



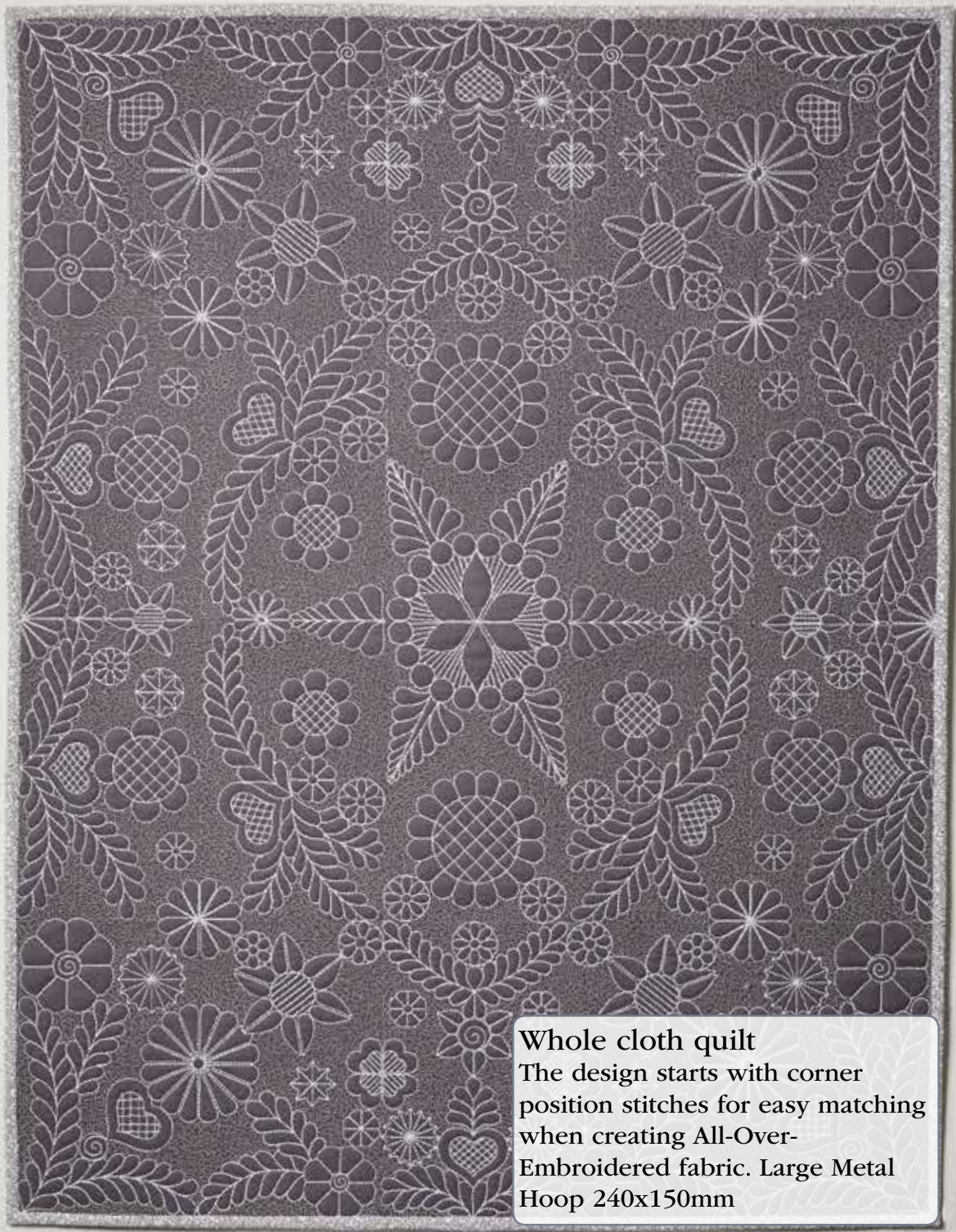


Quilt with blocks

All designs embroidered separately, and sewn together. The position stitch will be your guide when matching the designs together.
