

Tablet Case



Help protect your tablet, while traveling or when it's simply not in use, with this easy-to-make case. The outside felt features geometric cut outs, giving the case a modern design, and the black lining adds an extra level of protection. The tab at the end features a snap closure, for added safety. The size of the case is 11½" x 8½" (29cm x 21cm), adjust the size, if needed, to accommodate your tablet size.

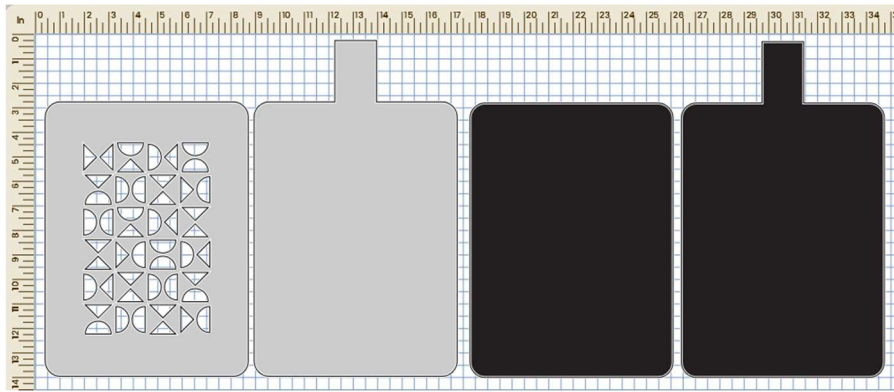
What you need

- Felt Fabric (Grey) 20" x 20" (50cm x 50cm)
- Felt Fabric (Black) 20" x 20" (50cm x 50cm)
- Fabric Grip Mat 24" x 24"
- Paper-backed Fusible Interfacing
- Snap Fastener
- Rotary Blade
- Brayer
- Sewing Machine

- All Purpose Thread
- Fabric Clips
- Iron and Ironing Board

Directions

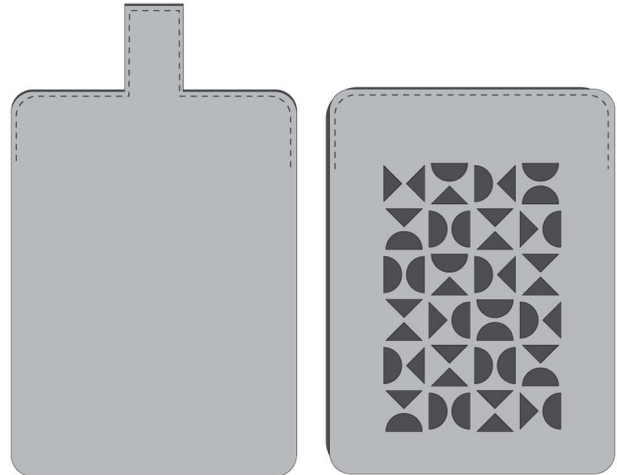
1. Follow the manufacturer's instructions to apply the fusible interfacing to wrong side of the outer felt fabric, using an iron or a heat press.
2. Open the project in Canvas. Go to the Output Menu and press Send to Machine. Remove the paper backing and place the felt on your Fabric Grip Mat, interfacing down. Use a Brayer to help adhere the material to the cutting mat, eliminating wrinkles or bubbles. Follow the steps to cut the felt on your crafting machine.



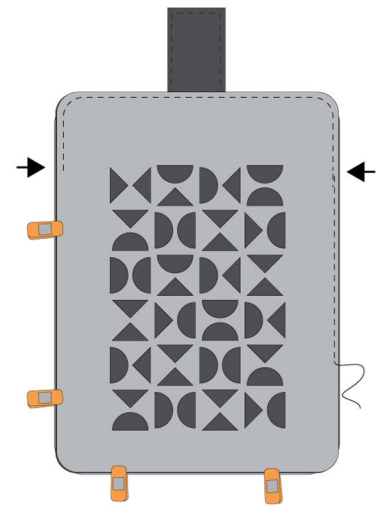
Note: Before you cut the design, make a test cut to determine the proper pressure and speed needed to cut through the felt and the interfacing.

3. Place the second felt piece (lining) on the mat and follow the steps to cut the material on your crafting machine.
4. Place the lining pieces on top of the outer case felt pieces and fuse the layers together using your iron or heat press.

5. Set your sewing machine for straight stitch. Topstitch the top edges of the openings, 1/8" (3mm) from the edge.



6. Place the front and back case pieces wrong sides together and stitch along the sides and bottom.



7. Add a snap fastener.
