Paper Necklace




A statement necklace is always special and eye-catching. This one is a series of circles cut from cardstock in graduating sizes, with a hole at the center. Just slip the circles onto a ribbon, tie it in the back and you're ready to go. Choose the colors and "stack" the circles as desired – monochromatic, ombre, color blocked – you're the designer! The finished size of the necklace is approximately 20" (50cm) long.

What you need

- +-25 Crafting Cardstock Sheets 12" x 12" in variety of colors (no white core)
- Standard Grip Mat 24" x 24"
- Basic Blade
- Scraper tool
- Satin Ribbon 1.5 Yard (140cm) long
- Large Eye Hand Sewing Needle

Directions


 Open the project in Canvas. Go to the Output Menu and press Send to Machine. Place the paper on your Standard Grip Mat and follow the steps to cut the material on your crafting machine.



2. After the first sheet is cut, make the file a favorite on the machine by selecting Save To Favorites on the machine's LCD screen.



3. Use the Scraper Tool or a Spatula to remove the circles from the mat. From each cardstock sheet there will be a pile about 1" (25mm) high. Continue cutting until you get as many paper circles you need to make the necklace the length you want.



4. Cut out the second mat layout twice (the first and the last color). The circles gradually decrease in size to create a tapered end.

5. Use the large eye needle to thread the paper circles onto the satin ribbon. Tie a knot at both ends to hold the paper circles in place. Trim the ribbon so you have enough to tie a bow.
