

Christmas Cracker Box



The Christmas Cracker has its origins in the United Kingdom. By tradition, it contains a paper crown, small gift, and a joke written on a piece of paper. Make your own version of the Christmas Cracker for your holiday party guests to start a fun, new tradition of your own! Each cracker has a finished size of approximately $2\frac{3}{8}$ " x $7\frac{7}{8}$ " (6cm x 20cm).


What you need

- Medium Cardstock (Green)
- Light Cardstock (Light Green)
- Glitter Paper
- ¾" (10mm) wide Satin Ribbon, 30" (75cm)
- Light Grip Mat 12" x 12"
- Basic Blade
- Fine Debossing Tip (for scoring)
- Adhesive
- Ruler (to aid with folding along scoring lines)


Directions

- 1. Open the project in Canvas.
- 2. Go to the Output Menu and press Send to Machine. Place the cardstock on your mat and follow the steps to score, draw and cut the material on your crafting machine.


Note: If you have a right and wrong side of your cardstock, place the right side face down on the mat. Scoring on the wrong side of your project makes it easier to fold.



3. Fold along the scoring lines. Use a ruler to help create sharp folds. Fold the diamond shapes in on themselves to make a valley fold.



4. Put adhesive on the scalloped edge piece, along the edges as shown below, and align the bottom glitter piece on top.



- 5. Glue the piece (from step 4) to the main box.
- 6. Glue your cracker together.
- 7. Cut the satin ribbon into two equally long pieces, about 15" (37cm). Bring one end of the box together and tie with a ribbon.
- 8. Pop in your paper crown, silly joke or personalized gift then tie a ribbon to close.
