

Paper Flower Window Decoration




These elegant paper flowers can be used in so many different ways! In addition to using them to decorate a wall, an inspiration board, or an event venue, why not try hanging a group of them in a window? They are quick to cut from large cardstock and can be easily hung using monofilament thread or fishline. Make them in a variety of colors, or all in one color for a monochromatic look. The flowers shown are each approximately 17" (43cm) in diameter.

What you need

- Large Sheet of Medium Cardstock or Poster Board
- Standard Grip Mat 24" x 24"
- Basic Blade
- Brayer
- Weeding Tool or Spatula
- Monofilament Thread or Fishline (for hanging the flower)
- Painter's Tape

Directions

- Open the project in Canvas. Place the cardstock onto the Standard Grip Mat. The cardstock is fairly large, so use a Brayer to help adhere it to the mat. Tape all four sides of the material down to the mat using painter's tape.
- Go to the Output Menu and press Send to Machine. Follow the steps to cut the flower shape on your crafting machine. Cut as many flowers as you like.



- 3. When finished, carefully remove it from the mat. Use a Weeding Tool or Spatula to remove the leftover cardstock bits from the mat.
- 4. Cut a piece of monofilament thread or fishing line, then tie it to the flower for hanging.
